• **Reminder from Dr. Wong:**

There are different types of seizures in children, which include spasms, focal seizures, generalized seizures, etc. A child can experience a seizure under certain circumstances, such as fever, head trauma, and drug abuse. Some seizures are caused by abnormal brain structure or genetic mutation. If you think your child has a ‘seizure attack’, do not panic. You can take your child to a pediatric neurologist. The doctor may ask certain important questions and do some tests for your kid. Accurate diagnosis and timely treatment are of paramount

importance for a child with a seizure disorder.

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
