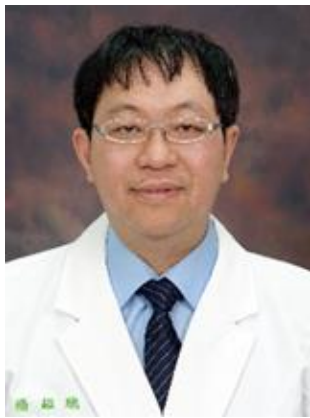

• **Reminder from Dr. Yang:**

Common symptoms of blood disorders include a pale appearance, palpitations, abnormal bleeding
